25 Additional physical description  Cemetery contains hundreds of graves ranging from the 1850s to the present.  Exhibits several ornate, Victorian era gravestones as well as cast iron fencing and cast concrete coping around large family plots. The entrance into the cemetery (from Main Street) features a nice rusticated granite arch that serves as a gateaway. "Evergreen Cemetery 1928" is inscribed at the apex of the arch. An inscription on the front pillar of the arch reads "This arch was erected and presented to the City of Perry as a gift from Dr. Charles R. Mann, who requested that a certain sum of money from his estate be given to the city." A poem, written by Edwin Martin in July 25, 1886, is inscribed on the back of the arch. The New Perry Hotel, built c. 1925, is a tile block bearing, three-story, hip roof building with stucco exterior dominated by a monumental, full-height portico and slightly projecting, full height hip sections on each end of the facade. A low-pitched, shed roof dormer vent is located in the center of the rear elevation. The upper floor features 4/4 windows and paired 6/6 windows while the central, first floor facade section of the hotel (lobby and dining room areas) feature fanlights over French doors that lead out onto a concrete terrace. The terrace feartures stuccoed masonry piers with cast iron railings. Original interior features include hard wood floors, plaster walls and ceilings, simple molded door and windows frames, baseboard, and two-panel doors. The stairwell features wainscoting and simple, decorative wood newel posts and square balusters. The first floor plan consists of a central lobby flanked by the dining room on the west and a wing of rooms (six total) on the east. The lobby area and dining room features a simple baseboard, chair rail, and molded comice. The second and third floor plans are essentially the same, with each floor having 17 rooms flanked by a central east-west hallway. All guest rooms feature a transom over the doorway. Great integrity.

The entire exterior of the building is clad in pressed tin panels. Very unique application of decorative pressed metal - outstanding resource. The sides of the building feature simulated (rusticated) concrete block pressed tin panels. The facade features several decorative pressed tin ornamental motifs. 
