General Information About Animals In Perry

- **Sec. 4-4. Offensive animals.** No dog or other pet or livestock shall be allowed to be offensive, infected with disease or otherwise become a nuisance, danger or threat to the health and safety of the inhabitants of the city.
- **Sec. 4-29. Restraint of animals.** It shall be unlawful to restrain an animal by tethering or any similar use of a chain, cable, rope or other stakeout or tie-out devices.
- **Sec. 4-32. Animal neglect.** It shall be unlawful for any owner to fail to provide his animals with sufficient and wholesome food and water, with proper shelter and protection from the weather, with veterinary care when needed to prevent suffering, and with humane care and treatment.
- Sec. 4-34. Abandonment. It shall be unlawful for any person to abandon an animal.
- **Sec. 4-36. Removal of waste.** It shall be unlawful for the owner of an animal to: Fail to immediately remove any excrement deposited by his animal on public property, walks, recreation areas or private property not owned or controlled by the owner of the animal. Fail to remove any excrement from their property and dispose of this waste on a daily basis.
- **Sec. 4-38. Rabies inoculation for dogs, cats and ferrets.** It shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog, cat or ferret housed, kept or boarded past three (3) months of age within the incorporated limits of the city to fail to have the animal(s) inoculated against rabies, and to have a rabies tag attached to animal's collar. The owner shall be liable for the inoculation of the animal.
- **Sec. 4-39. Number of dogs and cats per residential lot.** It shall be unlawful for there to be more than six (6) animals on any residential lot.
- **Sec. 4-59. Feeding of stray (feral) cats.** It shall be unlawful for any person to feed stray and/or feral cats, where such feeding causes a nuisance to neighbors or businesses, or creates a condition contrary to the health, safety and welfare of the community.
