**REFERENCE:** Disposal of leachate from landfill.

At your February 4, 2019 work session, Mr. Dan Groselle, ESG Operations, Inc., proposed the City consider accepting landfill leachate at the Frank Satterfield Wastewater Treatment Facility. After review by staff, the Administration recommends Council not proceed with this proposal. The reasons are:

1. The City's wastewater treatment process is a critical balance of organic factors and chemicals. Landfill leachate may contain predominately water, but there is no way to ensure there may not be harmful elements.
2. There is no need for the service from the Houston County Board of Commissioners landfill operation which the City uses for disposal.
3. Once started, from a practical standard point, it would be difficult to cease.
4. Over time, it may impact our permit requirements.
5. Projected growth will consume a sizeable amount of capacity.
6. The City could be pressured by industrial customers to not be required to provide pre-treatment.
